TOWN EMERGENCY SHELTER

WHAT TO BRING

Identification for all family members report to the shelter with you and important family documents (in a watertight container)

List of contacts (or cell phone) including contacts beyond the affected area

Cell charger(s)

Prescription medications, eye glasses/contact lenses, medical equipment with their related chargers

If a service animal is required, appropriate supplies for **you** to support their shelter stay

A full change of weather appropriate clothing (extra socks & underwear)

Personal hygiene items (toothbrush & paste, hand sanitizer, hairbrush, feminine hygiene items, contact lens supplies, toilet paper (1 or 2 rolls) etc.)

Infant necessities such as diapers and formula

Non-perishable food items **only** if you have special dietary needs

A flashlight and extra batteries, electrical power strip (multiple outlets)

Books, board games, and other activities for you and/or your children

If you have room, consider a set of headphones as a courtesy to others

TOWN EMERGENCY SHELTER

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Weapons (such as firearms or knives)
- Controlled/mind altering substances and drugs (unless prescribed)
- Alcohol
- Radios and portable TVs

Please keep in mind that electrical outlets could be scarce in an emergency shelter, and they may be reserved to charge phones for emergency calls only. Wi-Fi services probably will not be available so **PLEASE** leave all other electronic devices at home.
